The Desert Shores Community Association is a non-profit corporation specifically established by Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions filed on June 1, 1988, in Book 880601, as Document No. 00011, of the Official Records of Clark County, Nevada, for the purpose of operating the business affairs of its homeowners association.

BOARD NEWS

The Desert Shores Community Association Board of Directors meeting was held Wednesday, May 26, 2004.

Representatives from Jaramillo Landscape Maintenance brought the members up to date on the landscape work performed since they came to the property March 1, 2004. There were many compliments from the homeowners on the quality of the work being performed, especially the pruning of the Pine trees.

Action was taken on the following:

- Minutes of the April 28, 2004 Board of Directors meeting approved.
- Minutes of the May 12, 2004 Budget Ratification meeting approved.
- Minutes of the April 5, 2004 Community Relations Committee meeting approved.
- Treasurer's Report for month ending April 30, 2004 accepted subject to audit.
- Resolution to approve installation of artificial turf in front yards to take effect August 1, 2004 contingent upon positive study information received from City of Las Vegas.
- DSCA master insurance policy renewal tabled awaiting clarification on proposals.
- Extension of peddle boat season. Members will be able to use pedal boats on weekends through the month of September. Consideration will be given to extending the season further if boats are used.
- Contract with Securitas renewed. In addition to truck patrol, effective immediately a bicycle patrol will be put into service. Bike patrol will be in service June through September.
- John Fareio appointed Community Relations Committee Chair.
- Gail Qualey appointed Lakes Committee Chair.
- Due to safety concerns, owners will no longer be able to access lagoon area with key that was acquired by a \$50.00 deposit. Owners who wish to continue using their key to access the Soft Winds end of Lake Sarah may keep the key. Notices will be sent to all owners with keys to determine if they would like to keep their key or have their deposit returned.

The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors will be held July 28, 2004, 6:00 p.m.

ASSOCIATION NEWS

Early in 2002 the Board of Directors, at the request of homeowners, looked into the possibility of offering an ACH (Automated Clearing House) service to allow owners to make electronic payments. ACH automatically deducts monthly payments directly from the owners checking account, regardless of what bank is used. The other service was a lock box system which allows owners to mail their monthly assessment directly to US Bank. By mailing payments directly to the bank, it reduces time lost in mail float, processing and delivery.

Over 400 owners have taken advantage of the ACH service and we add a few new owners each month. The lock box service has served us well with the majority of our owners mailing their check and coupon to the US Bank lock box in San Diego. Each month, however, we still have a very small percentage of owners who deliver their checks to the Association office.

In order to have all checks processed at the lock box we are asking all owners to please use their coupons and envelopes and mail monthly fees to the address printed on the coupon. Effective September 1, 2004 all current monthly fees are to be mailed, they will no longer be accepted in the office.

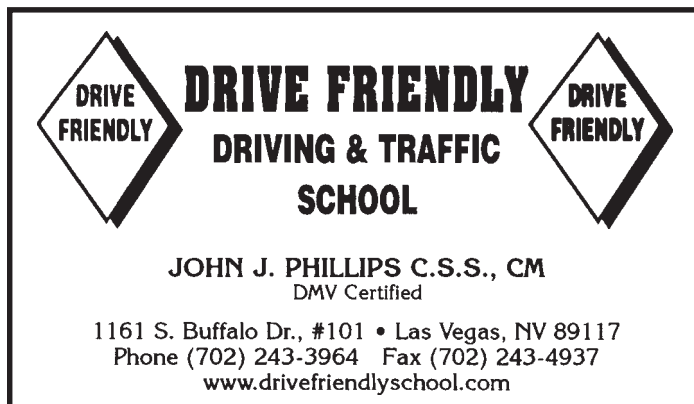

Community Relations Committee

How well do you know your CC&R's?

The Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions (CC&R's) for our community were recorded with Clark County in June of 1988. Do you know that the CC&R's are part of your deed? They are a deed restriction and run with the land no matter who owns it. This means that you are automatically a member of the Desert Shores Community Association. The CC&R's are not meant to restrict individual freedom, but to preserve and protect the value of our community so that you can feel confident that the community will remain attractive and that the amenities will continue to be maintained.

Your monthly assessment pays for the upkeep and maintenance of all the common areas including the lakes, lagoon and clubhouse area, paddle boats and community docks, sign monuments, landscaping and irrigation, fences and walls as well as funding the office facility and administration, insurance, utilities and the reserve fund.



ARC Policies & Guidelines

The Neighbor Impact statement that DSCA requires you to have your neighbors sign is informational only. It is intended to bring to their attention that you are installing improvements that may impact their use and enjoyment of their property. The approval or denial of improvements if granted solely by the Committee.

The Community Relations Committee meets on the first Monday of each month to review submittals. To assist the Committee please make sure that your submittal application is complete. Sub-association owners must have approval from their association Board of Directors prior to submitting their applications to the DSCA Community Relations Committee.

Midge Fly Treatment

Treatment for midge flies on the lakes was started during the first week of April. Treatment will continue every two weeks through September. The intent of this treatment is to control the midge flies, it will not completely eradicate them. Midge flies live in 48-hour cycles, laying eggs in the lake mud.

DSCA Landscape Committee Update

Tree Survey Completed

On Monday, June 7th, a survey was conducted of all trees growing in the common areas of Desert Shores. Those attending were: Dennis Swartzell, certified tree arborist; Jack Zunnio and Amy Wojtech; of Zunnio Associates; Rita Peterson, Desert Shores General Manager; and Jim Carollo, landscape committee chairman.

Trees were assessed in three categories; liability to homeowners and their property, disease, and aesthetics. I am pleased to report that out of one thousand and three trees only twenty-five will be removed, all because of

liability reasons. Although no disease was evident in any trees, several are in a state of stress. To solve the stress problem Mr. Swartzell suggested a deep root fertilization program. Tree removal and the fertilization program will begin in the near future.

Following the tree removal, the next steps of the retrofit program will be review of new plan from Zunnio Associates, plant selection, contractor bidding, board approval and finally groundbreaking.

The mission of the Desert Shores Social Club is to provide an organization for adults who live in Desert Shores to meet and form friendships and plan events in which all members can participate in an atmosphere of a social and friendly environment.

What you need to know about curfews

Now that the new year is in full swing, life will be getting back to normal. While adults will be engaged in grown up activities, some teens, and even young children, will be left to fare for themselves. Teens with wheels will be advised to be home at a reasonable hour. Those who don't drive will be dropped off at one of many theater complexes scattered around the Valley. Unfortunately, even goods kids get into trouble. Especially, when you and they are unaware of curfew laws.

Curfew, Ages and Hours Designated: It is unlawful for any child under the age of 18 years to be in or upon any public street, sidewalk, highway, vacant lot or other public place between the hours of 10 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 5 a.m. of the succeeding day, and between the hours of 12 midnight on Friday and Saturday and 5 a.m. of the succeeding day.

On all school holidays and during the summer vacation, said curfew shall be between the hours of 12 midnight and 5 a.m. for all citizens under the age of 18 years.

Curfew Prohibited Locations: It is unlawful for any child under the age of 18 to be in or upon streets or sidewalks adjacent thereto and all parking lots, driveways and walkways which are open to the public and located on properties commonly referred to as the Strip. This prohibition is in effect between the hours of 9 p.m. on Friday, Saturday and legal holidays and 5 a.m. of the succeeding day.

Curfew Exceptions: A child under the age of 18 who is accompanied by his or her parent, or other responsible person who is over the age of twenty-one and approved by the child's parent or legal guardian.

Children under the age 18 and legally employed, for the period from one-half hour before to one-half hour after work, while going directly between his or her home and place of employment. This exception shall also apply if the child is in a public place during curfew hours in the course of his or her employment. To come under this exception, the child must be carrying a written statement from the employer attesting to the place and hours of employment.

If children under the age of 18 and are coming directly home from a meeting or a place of public entertaining, such as a movie, play or sporting event, or from a school, social or religious activity. This exception will apply for one-half hour after the completion of such event, but in no case beyond a.m.

If a child under the age of 18 is, with the consent of his or her parent or legal guardian, engaged in interstate travel or on an emergency errand.

Just a reminder about **alcoholic beverages and minors:** It is unlawful for any person under the age of 21 to buy, receive, have in his or her possession or consume outside of his or her dwelling place any beer, or malt beverage, or alcoholic beverage.

In addition to the driving Courtesy Patrol we now have a Bike Patrol. You will see the Bike Patrol officer touring the community from 3:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. seven days a week.

Community Emergency Response Training

The CERT Program trains people in neighborhoods, the workplace, and schools in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, urban search and rescue, and medical operations, and helps them take a more active role in emergency preparedness. Locally, the CERT effort is coordinated by City of Las Vegas Fire Services. To date over 600 community residents have completed CERT Training. Sprinkler Watering Tips

Some lawns require more or less water, depending upon the type of grass you have. Adding or removing one minute from the watering time will change the amount of water you use by 25 percent.

▶ For each assigned day of watering, water your lawn 3 times a day, 4 minutes each watering. Schedule start times at least one hour apart. This is called the cycle & soak method of watering. It allows your lawn to absorb the water more effectively than running the sprinklers for 12 consecutive minutes. If you have rotating sprinklers, water for 12 minutes each watering, rather than 4 minutes.



▶ Adjust your sprinkler heads so they don't spray walls, driveways or sidewalk. Try to check your sprinkler system weekly and immediately replace broken or missing sprinklers.

▶ Avoid watering when it's windy or rainy. Shutting off the sprinklers on rainy days can save 500 gallons of water a day.

▶ Did you know that warm season grasses, such as Bermuda, require about one-third less water? And did you know that shaded areas of your lawn require about 30 percent less water? Try to adjust your water accordingly.

▶ Water between midnight and sunrise from May to October to minimize water lost to evaporation. Water during the warmer part of the day from November to April to prevent water from freezing on your landscape.

▶ For best results, shoot for "head to head" coverage. That means the spray of one sprinkler should reach the head of the sprinkler closest to it.
